

## A Discourse of the most famous Doctor

*John Faustus of Wittenberg in Germanie, Coniurer,*

and Necromancer: wherein is declared many strange  
things that he himself hath scene, and done in the  
earth and in the Ayre, with his bringing vp  
his trauailes, studies, and last end.

*Of his Parentage and Birth. Chap. I.*

**I**n the towne of Rhode, lying in the Province of Weimer in Germanye, his father a poore husbandman, and not wel to bring him vp: but having an Uncle at Wittenberg, a rich man, & without issue, took this I. Faustus from his father, & made him his heire, in so much that his father was no man troubled with him, for he remained with his Uncle at Wittenberg, where he was kept at the Universitie in the same citie to study Divinitie. But Faustus being of a naughty minde & otherwise aduised, applied not his studie, but toke himself to other exercises: he which his Uncle often times hearing rebuked him for it, as Eli oft times rebuked his children for sinning against the Lord: even so this god man laboured to have Faustus apply his studie of Divinitie, that he might come to the knowledge of God & his lawes. But it is manifest that many vertuous parents haue vicked children, as Cayn, Ruben, Absolom, and such like haue been to their parents: so this Faustus hauing godly parents, and seeing him to be of a reward witt, were very desirous to bring him vp in thole vertuous studie, namely, of Divinitie: but he gaue himself secretly to study Necromancy and Coniuration, in so much that few or none could perceive his profession.

But to the purpose: Faustus continued at study in the Universitie, & was by the Rectors and sixteene Masters afterwards examined howe he had profited in his studie; and being found by them, that none for his time were able to argue with him in Divinitie, or for the excellency of his wisedome to compare with him, with one consent they made him Doctor of Divinitie. But Doctor Faustus wch in short time after he had obtained his degree, fell into such fantasies and brewe cogitations, that he was marked of many, and of the most part of the Students: his called the Speculator; and sometime he would throw the Scriptur
